The New Indianapolis Airport will feature a modern terminal built in the “midfield” area of the present airport, between the two main runways. The heart of the terminal building is a Civic Plaza, a central gathering point whose circular shape recalls the shape of the City’s central public space, Monument Circle. Although the plaza will serve the necessary functions of both security and concessions, the room is designed to incorporate artwork, provide public event space and enable visitors to sample the character of Indianapolis and the region. The form of the terminal roof is shaped to create a symbolic threshold to the city and state, emanating from the Civic Plaza. The form is generated by joining the sheltering, centralized shape of an arch with the rise and fall of the building from check-in to departure. Encompassing high glass walls, the building rises over the plaza to reveal a view of the aircraft apron and the city skyline. The terminal is designed as a dynamic, changing form that reveals its purpose as destination, gateway and powerful symbol of the city.

INDY'S NEW AIRPORT

Terminal Site

The midfield terminal site is on unencumbered "greenfield" site that has been reserved for the airport's expansion since 1975. The site is nearly a mile wide, over two miles in length, and has ample space for landside and airside development.

Landside Development

Landside development of the new airport will provide roadway access, utilities distribution, vehicle parking, support facilities and commercial development areas for the terminal area complex.

Airside Development

The airside development of the new airport will provide the aircraft parking, access to the runways, and aviation support facilities. The midfield layout will facilitate the efficient movement of aircraft. Connector taxiways will align with existing exit taxiways to provide the shortest and most direct route to aircraft gates, thereby reducing taxiing time.

Surface Transportation Access

The new airport terminal and concourses will be served primarily by a free-flowing, multi-lane, dedicated central parkway from I-70. The roadway median could also accommodate future light rail development. A surface road system will provide access to airport support facilities.

Master Designer

The Indianapolis Airport Authority has selected St. Louis-based Hellmuth, Obata + Kassabaum, Inc. (HOK), an internationally known architecture, engineering and construction planning firm, as Master Designer for the New Indianapolis Airport. As Master Designer, HOK will provide a comprehensive design solution for the entire development.


Environmental Management

Construction of the New Indianapolis Airport will provide unique opportunities to develop environmentally friendly buildings and sites. The midfield terminal will incorporate the latest green practices that are considered hallmarks of sustainable development. Operational efficiencies will be gained by incorporating energy-efficient architectural designs and energy management systems.

Public Artwork

Through the use of commissioned, site-specific or architecturally integrated works of art, the New Indianapolis Airport will provide visitors access to a wide variety of artists and art forms from Indianapolis, Indiana, the United States and the world. An Airport Arts & Culture Program will provide temporary exhibitions of art by local artists as well as a performing arts series, and will highlight the rich cultural diversity of the City.

PARKING

FREE CELL PHONE LOT

Waiting for passengers to land? Park at our free cell phone lot, which features 49 spaces available on a first-come, first-served basis. Once passengers have claimed their bags, they can call your cell phone and you can pull to the curb on the lower-level drive, load luggage and carry-on items in your car, then exit the airport.

PARKING PAYMENT OPTIONS

All parking lots and garage exits accept credit card payments, but those who prefer to pay with cash can use one of six cashier booths and/or one of 16 pay-on-foot stations (garage only). Hourly and daily garage parking is available.

PARKING SERVICES & RATES

Can't find your car or arriving on a late-night flight? Our roving, 24-hour parking assistance vehicle has a driver to help passengers locate lost vehicles and escort solo travelers safely to their cars.

-Express Valet, \$18/day: Let us park your car for you! Cars will be parked under covered roof for the duration of your trip.

-Rooftop Valet, \$15/day: We will park your car for you on the top floor of the garage (not under cover).

-Parking Garage (self park), \$16/day: Park your car in one of 5,900 spaces in our garage for \$2 per 30 minutes or a maximum of \$16 every 24 hours.

-Long-Term Parking, \$11/day: This quick, convenient lot contains 4,400 spaces for you to park and take a shuttle to and from the terminal.

-Economy Parking, \$7/day: With nearly 8,000 spaces and shuttle service to and from the terminal, this lot combines convenience with cost-effectiveness.

PARKING GARAGE & PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

With ten elevators, eight escalators, and four moving walkways, the garage has been built with maximum customer convenience, comfort, accessibility, and mobility in mind.

The spacious new parking garage is tripled in size and is located a short walk from the terminal. It is connected to the terminal via an enclosed pedestrian bridge, which features moving sidewalks and a unique overhead art display.


The pedestrian bridge is located on the third floor of the parking garage as is a cluster of walk-and-pay stations accepting both cash and credit cards. Additional pay stations are located on the first, second, and fourth levels of the garage.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION CENTER

There is no need to catch a shuttle to rent a car at the new airport! Eight rental car facilities offering hundreds of cars to meet all budget and size requirements are located on the first floor of the parking garage.

Taxi, limousine, hotel courtesy vehicle, charter bus, and other transportation options can be arranged at the Ground Transportation Center, also on the first floor of the parking garage.
